

Quizlet Tips to Get the Most Out of Your Studying Time

Once you join my class, you'll see study sets. I'll add more as we cover more topics. Click on the one you want to study.

With all activities, I recommend going into options and making sure "answer with term" is selected. Quizlet requires everything to be typed exactly to be right, which makes typing the long definitions much harder. If you get good, you can always change this option in flashcards and quiz yourself without needing to type anything in.

Once you're in a study set, you'll have activity tabs to study or play games.

- FLASHCARDS: This is where I recommend you start. For the rest of the activities, Quizlet needs terms to be typed exactly—so, you'll want to see how I typed them in.
- LEARN: I'm most excited about the LEARN tab because they just added the ability to study a diagram. Check it out with the animal cell in the Classification and Cells set. **When it's a diagram question, they'll have a term on the screen and you have to pick which glowing dot matches
- WRITE—Quizlet gives a definition and you type the matching term
- SPELL—Quizlet says a definition and you type the matching term
- TEST—This tab includes some extra options to choose how many questions and whether they should be written, matching, multiple choice, and/or true/false.
- MATCH—A game where you select a term and a definition that match to make them disappear until all are gone
- GRAVITY—A game where you have to type the term before the definition reaching the ground

*High scores are tracked for both games

- LIVE—This is a game that has to be played in the classroom.
